



This PDW builds upon the successful 2009 AOM Cross Sector Partnership PDW convened in Chicago. During this previous PDW, a number of themes related to Passion and Compassion emerged that bear further exploration. First, we emphasize the collaborative relationships between organizations and governments in development activity to create a more humane, just, and fair society. Second, we consider how partnership arrangements differ across national boundaries. In this context, questions brought forward include: how are the inherent instabilities of governments and NGOs in developing nations accounted for? Whose interests are being advanced, and how can marginalized groups speak for themselves? How are partnership values and opportunities redefined over time? Who should convene development dialogues? Additionally, we might ask how do the perspectives of the Northern aid agencies (USAID, DFID, CIDA, etc.) in relation to partnership processes or outcomes differ from those in the South? This PDW will provide a dynamic interaction between academics and practitioners who are interested in cross sector partnerships whose goals are economic development for the disadvantaged and the sustainability of natural resources. Practitioners will present learnings from partnerships in developing countries. Academics with expertise in cross sector partnership research will engage with the issues presented from their various perspectives. Together, all participants will explore and seek to further develop and/or to challenge extant explanatory frameworks for successful collaborative cross-sectoral partnering. The goal of the PDW is to build on alliance theory through interaction among researchers and practitioners interested in cross sector partnerships. Ideas for future research or practice projects will be generated.
